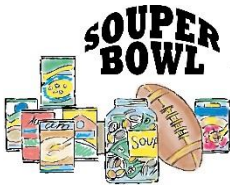

Being Rich Toward God

The society in which we live tells us that more is better. We're told that in order to be happy we must have the newest and best things. People foolishly believe that money provides a lifetime of security, so they spend their time and resources chasing after it. Unfortunately, even if they are successful in their pursuit of money and the things money can buy, their lives are often filled with loneliness and despair.



Rather than being rich toward money, God wants you to be "*rich toward God.*" In Luke 12:21, Jesus is telling his listeners that, if we store up things only for ourselves and are not "*rich toward God,*" we will have the same fate as the Rich Fool. In order for you to be "*rich toward God*" with your money, you need to acknowledge that God is the source of all that you have. You must come to understand that money is to be used rather than to be hoarded. Your primary goal is not to amass more money for personal use and enjoyment, but instead to glorify God through the use of your money. You can use it in ways that glorify God by leading others to Christ. In this way, you will be "*rich toward God.*" **Prayer:** Dear Lord, help me to develop a right and proper attitude toward the money that you have entrusted to me. Help me to see my money as a tool to help others. In Jesus' name I pray. **Amen.**
