## OCTOBER MISSION - FLOOD BUCKETS

Remember the Flood Bucket Brigade of March, 2016? It has been over a 18 months and there's been a lot of water that created floods throughout the US.

Last year (2016) Mary Bates and the HARP\* Mission Center (Caldwell, OH) were involved in:

Disaster Response: Over 4,000 families were flooded in southern West Virginia and 23 people died. Hurricane Matthew struck 4 states, devastating North Carolina. Wildfires impacted 4 southern states, destroying Gatlingburg TN vicinity. HARP provided warehousing and truck delivery for over 3,000 quilts, over 1500 flood buckets, over 2100 health kits, over 700 school kits, and over 500 layettes.

What's a Flood Bucket?

One 5 gallon bucket or 3 gallon bucket filled with

2 large trash bags, 1 gallon Bleach, 1 Can of Comet or scouring cleanser, 1 bottle of PineSol or liquid cleaner, 1 bottle of dish soap, 1 scrub brush, Dust Mask (N-95 recommended), Rubber gloves
