

Texas recovery efforts rely on the compassionate people of the LCMS

Near the 12th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina, southeastern Texas faces perhaps even greater devastation brought on by Hurricane Harvey, which reportedly will surpass Katrina in terms of flooding and damage.

The remnants of Hurricane Harvey have finally moved inland and away from Houston. As the search and rescue phase continues, it will be some time before the waters recede and damage analysis can begin in earnest. One early estimate placed the flooded area in Harris County, TX alone at more than **400 square miles**. For comparison, Orleans Parish is 169 square miles. After Katrina, compassionate people across the Synod came together, and some 6,000 homes were rebuilt in East New Orleans, via Camp Restore of the Synod's Southern District.

Continuing this legacy of mercy with Hurricane Harvey, help and encouragement from across the Synod remain vital to recovery efforts that will be ongoing for months and years to come. The scope of the Synod's response depends on the people of the LCMS responding.

LCMS World Relief and Human Care, through its LCMS Disaster Response team, is mobilizing to come alongside the Synod's Texas District, bringing urgent relief and the hope of the Gospel to Texans whose lives have been shaken by this unprecedented catastrophe. This includes the communities of some 161 congregations.

Our Statement of Gift Utilization

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod will utilize all contributions given in the wake of the Harvey event only for measured, deliberate and effective relief and recovery efforts in partnership with the affected congregations and the Texas District, and reporting of their use back to the church-at-large. Should the total in gifts from God's people exceed what is required in this particular response effort, the remaining funds will be held in a specific and unique account restricted for the exclusive use by LCMS Disaster Response in future relief and response situations, including advance training of local volunteer disaster responders. In accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles, the Donor Bill of Rights and our fund-raising Code of Ethics, excess disaster gifts will NOT be re-directed to work unrelated to disaster response work.
