The Condition of your Heart Determines your Attitude toward Giving

“For I testify that [the Macedonians] gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability ... And they did not do as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then to us in keeping with God’s will” (2 Corinthians 8:3-6).

After Jesus changed Zacchaeus’s heart, Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector, *“stood up and said to the Lord, ‘Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.’”* Zacchaeus stopped hoarding his money and began using it as a tool to help others and give glory to God.

“As he looked up, Jesus saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins. ‘I tell you the truth,’ he said, ‘this poor widow has put in more than all the others.
